NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that **Trewern Community Council** intends to Co-opt **1 member** to fill the vacancy that exist in the office of Councillor for the Community (Ward).

Expressions of interest are being sought from members of the public who meet the following qualifications and are interested in representing their community on the aforementioned Community Council. You must be a British citizen, an eligible Commonwealth citizen, a citizen of any member state of the European Union citizen or a qualifying foreign citizen and not require leave to enter or remain in the United Kingdom or have indefinite leave to remain.

You must be 18 years of age or over; and meet at least one of the following criteria:

- · registered as a local government elector for the area named above; or
- during the whole of the last 12 months occupied as owner or tenant land or other premises in the community named above; or
- your principal or only place of work during the last 12 months has been in the community named above; or

¹ Certain people are disqualified from standing, and these include paid officers of the community council, anyone subject to bankruptcy restriction orders and those subject to recent sentences of imprisonment.



Powys County Council's Road Safety Unit will be holding its informal Driver Theory Refresher workshop on the following Wednesdays:

15 February, 22 March, 18 April, 24 May & 21 June 2023

The informal workshop covers subjects such as The Fatal Five, how to proceed when encountering vulnerable road users such as motor and pedal cyclists, and equestrians, what to do if you're involved in a collision, eyesight requirements, medication and alcohol laws, and the important changes to the Highway Code, that were introduced in 2022.

Attendees will also be given information and contact details about going on one of the free, one hour 'Drive-On' assessments with a local Advanced Driving Instructor.



I've seen offers for 'Buy Now Pay Later' when I'm doing online shopping. It seems like a good way to spread the cost of some of the things I need to get for my family but how can I make sure I don't get into debt?

With everything getting more expensive, this is a really difficult time for a lot of people, so it's sensible to be thinking about how you can manage. There are lots of things you can do to try and stay in control of your money.

Before you start spending, work out exactly what money you have coming in and going out each month. Be realistic about what you need for essentials like food and travel. Take a look at the budgeting tool on the Citizens Advice website. This can help you set a budget you can stick to.

You'll also be able to find tips on how to reduce your regular living costs, which might be helpful if you're struggling to keep within your budget.

While it can be tempting to split payments with schemes like Buy Now Pay Later (BNPL), you'll need a plan to pay the money back. If you're using something like that repeatedly, you might be managing for now, but it could also be a sign that it's unaffordable in the long run. Keep a record of how much you owe in total.

Always make sure you understand what you're signing up for, how you'll make the repayments and what will happen if you can't pay on time. It's important to check the returns process for both the retailer and credit provider. Paying through BNPL may also affect the cost of postage returns if you've ordered online. The riskiest thing about it is that you're not guaranteed to be protected if something goes wrong. For example, you can't go to the Financial Ombudsman Service if you have a complaint.

If you find yourself turning to credit cards, your overdraft, or store cards for your spending, keep track of what you owe. You should prioritise paying your rent or mortgage, plus energy bills and Council Tax first, because not paying these has the most serious consequences. On the Citizens Advice website, you can find information on what bills to prioritise and how to manage debts. There's also information on the support available for paying these and other bills.

If, like many during this crisis, you find you can't afford to reduce your debts after paying your priority bills and essentials, seek advice as soon as possible. If you need specific support or don't feel able to manage your situation alone, call our debt helpline: 0800 240 4420.

Dear all, I have the following matters to update you on:

Highways

We have had some periods of icy weather and grit/salt supplies have been used in various places across the area. If you know of a grit pile/bin which needs topping up please let me know or report here:

https://en.powys.gov.uk/article/9901/Report-a-Problem-with-Salt-bins-Gritting-or-Footways?formExpired=true

The highways gritting team do on occasion grit smaller county roads other than the A458 trunk road. However, this is not always possible and due to resources they cannot always get to everywhere for when people are leaving home first thing in the morning. Please do use the salt/grit supplies near you for your safety on the roads.

Unfortunately, despite numerous reporting of blocked drains up towards Mount Pleasant in Middletown, these drains were not done before temperatures dropped and water running down the road froze and became very dangerous. Myself and others had already predicted and warned the council that this could occur and so photos were sent evidencing this. The community council have also written to senior highways officers about this matter highlighting the health and safety risk. There are still drains that need jetting in various other places and we will continue to report these to the council. I am pleased that residents have fed back to me that the drainage and ditching work done in the Sale Lane and Heldre Lane going down towards Sale Lane area seems to alleviated potential flooding from some of the recent heavy rain.

Following a tragic incident involving a car driving too fast and close to a horse being ridden on Criggion lane, I am working with the Council and in communication with the British Horse Society to try and get some appropriate road safety signs along this stretch. If you ride out in this area and agree that this is needed, please do get in touch with me as it would be helpful to submit as much as possible as part of our case for safety signs.

Other Council Matters

During the last few weeks, I have been reviewing the Council's Social Care budgets which we are told are still under considerable pressure. My committee will be scrutinising these as part of the wider budget setting process, looking at whether their predicted financial pressures seem evidenced/justified and also the potential impact of proposed cost efficiencies e.g. closing day centres or reducing travel of social workers. I do have concerns about some of these proposals and so it is important that these are robustly scrutinised. Adults and Children's Social services makes up a huge part of the council's budget - considerably more than the money that goes towards highways and recycling.

I will be attending this surgery with Craig Williams MP if you want to come and raise any issues with us.



Anything with a plug, cable or battery, working or broken, can be recycled to ensure it doesn't needlessly end up in landfill. It is estimated that each year binned electrical items cost the UK economy over £370 million of lost valuable raw materials, such as gold, copper, aluminium and steel.

Potters/Welshpool Recycling Centre will accept more than 200 different types of electrical item as well as batteries and light bulbs.

Crushed batteries can cause fires at recycling centres so should always be removed before a battery powered item is taken for recycling. The batteries can then be safely recycled separately at Potters or many local supermarkets.
