

IMPORTANT NOTICE about the EU Settlement Scheme

Government rules mean that EU and EFTA citizens living in the UK must apply for settled or pre-settled status by 30th June.



There is concern that some people who will be affected by this change may not be aware that they need to apply. In particular, information on the relevant government website (https://www.gov.uk/eusettledstatus) indicates that the following people need to apply:

- Holders of previously granted UK permanent residency cards.
 - These will no longer be valid after 30 June 2021 and people holding them need to apply.
- Dependent family members.
 - Each dependent family member, including children, must complete an individual EUSS application.

Applying to the scheme is free and it is important that every EU and EFTA citizen who may be affected should apply before the deadline.

If you know anyone who may be affected, please check that they have applied. This is especially important for people in vulnerable groups (e.g. elderly people, people without internet access, children in care).

'Paws' for Thought

Eye-catching paw prints are popping up around the county, leading the way to the nearest bin, as a reminder for careless owners to clean up after their dogs when out on a walk.

While most dog owners are responsible individuals, there are still some people who do not clean up after their pets, leaving our streets and open spaces prone to dog fouling.

Powys County Council's latest campaign is a subtle reminder that dog poo should be bagged and binned at any public litter bin.

The campaign to reduce dog fouling is part of the Caru Cymru project, a Wales wide initiative to eradicate litter and waste and inspire everyone to take action and care for the environment.

Anyone who fails to clear up after their dog can be fined up to £1,000.

Tackling falls in the home

Powys County Council and Care & Repair in Powys have teamed up to try and prevent falls in the home which are a constant worry for many residents.

Whether it is struggling to manage the stairs, get on and off the toilet, bathe or shower safely or get in and out of the house safely, help is now at hand from the partnership which will identify equipment or adaptations which can help residents to continue to live independently at home.

Small tips like removing mats, rugs and other items that could cause a fall are being offered as well as ensuring all rooms, passages and staircases are well lit. Wearing well-fitting shoes or slippers that are in good condition and support the ankle will decrease the risk of falls further.

Debbie Brooks, Casework & Service Manager with Care & Repair has explained that for help with smaller adaptations such as the installation of grab rails or the levelling of paths, Powys residents should contact Care & Repair in Powys directly on 01686 620760 or by emailing enquiries@crpowys.co.uk

For larger scale alterations, such as the installation of stair lifts or or making a bathroom easier to use, Powys residents should contact Powys Council's ASSIST team on 0345 602 7050 or contact the team online at https://en.powys.gov.uk/article/6948/Contact-Assist-Online.

The majority of their nature reserves are open, but some restrictions may apply on some sites – please check our online

nature reserves pages before you visit and follow the current Welsh Government restrictions. Visitors are asked to adhere to social distancing and socialising guidance at all times.

WLLR has a wide range of measures in place to ensure that visitors feel comfortable when they return to this beautiful Mid Wales railway.

These include social distancing of seats on-board trains which now have a capacity well below half of pre-Covid times, providing not just a distanced experience but also a more relaxed one. It is advised that you book seats as soon as you can, where possible, before the day of travel.

Their traditional tea room is temporarily closed, but facilities providing hot and cold drinks, hot and cold food and ice-creams for summer days are available. You'll find a number of hand sanitising points around the railway and one way systems, too. All visitors aged 12 and over are asked to wear face coverings at all times (unless eating or drinking).

WLLR has been recognised as a tourist organisation eligible for the Visit Wales / Visit England Good to Go scheme due to the steps they have taken for re-opening. All trains depart from Llanfair Caereinion.

Network Rail Close Rail Line for 6 Weeks

Rail users will face six weeks of replacement bus services after Network Rail announced that the line will be closed so that a troubled bridge can be raised.

Engineers began work to raise Black Bridge, near Machynlleth, on 15 May to reduce passenger delays due to flooding. In recent years, the bridge has been repeatedly flooded in bad weather, causing regular closures on the Machynlleth to Shrewsbury route. The railway will be closed until June 28 so that the main work to raise the bridge and re-profile the track can be carried out safely.

Transport for Wales said it will provide replacement bus services between Machynlleth and Shrewsbury during this time. There will also be an amended timetable in operation from Pwllheli and Aberystwyth to Machynlleth.

Alexia Course, Transport for Wales' Transport Operations Director, has said "Our team will be working hard to support our customers throughout the improvement work. We understand disruption to services is frustrating for our customers, and we would like to thank them in advance for their patience while this work is taking place."

I hope that you are all well and looking forward to the Summer. It has been a busy few months in our ward with various planning consultations taking place.

Buttington Incinerator Consultation

Firstly we have had the Buttington Incinerator ERF Consultation that ended on the 24th May. The Welsh Planning Inspectorate has informed me that the process is currently paused until the end of June in order to allow Natural Resource Wales to put in a response (as they missed the email inviting them to respond!!!). After that the Inspector will confirm the next stage of the process and give the relevant notice periods. The most likely scenario is that a hearing/enquiry stage will take place from September.

I know that many of you are disappointed this consultation and planning process is progressing, given that in March the Welsh Government announced there would be a moratorium with immediate effect for all new large scale incinerators. However, as the Welsh Government have not formally directed otherwise, the planning process has to proceed. I continue to work with Russell George, our Senedd Member, who is awaiting a response from the Minister on the status of the moratorium and how it applies to this planning application.

I was disappointed to see that the Welsh Government Highways Agency submitted a response to the incinerator consultation saying that they had no comment to make on the consultation. Given that during the construction phase there will be a period of up to 141 HGVs going in and out of the site per day, this response in my view does not take into account the considerable impact on an already problematic road. I have written directly to the Welsh Government Minister for highways to highlight this and ask that they look at the matter again.

I would like to thank the Buttington Incinerator Impact Group for the amount of work and effort they have put into helping people respond to this consultation, raising awareness and highlighting how this proposal will impact our area.

Planning Application Adjacent to the School

There has also been a housing application submitted which if developed would see a new entrance and improved school car park design. The Community Council, School Leadership, governors and myself have fed into this. In particular, the governors have put in considerable work and submitted comments and suggestions to ensure that the school entrance and car park design is safe, increases capacity and will be practical and suitable for the school. Both the community council and myself have endorsed these suggestions.

Highways

We continue to need many improvements to our county roads and drains. Earlier this year, I wrote to senior highways officers highlighting (again) many of the on-going problems caused by lack of drain/gulley clearance. I was told that many of our roads are not considered a priority because they are country lanes. I have continued to express concern and take this to the most senior level. We have now started to see some work take place on some of the worst patches.

A458 Trunk Road – sadly we continue to see accidents in our area, again with a recent one on the Cefn Bridge. Last year I wrote to the previous Welsh Government Minister to highlight concerns and make a number of suggestions for consideration. Unfortunately this wasn't taken seriously and we

were advised to raise matters through the Go Safe scheme. The Community Council then invited the Go Safe representatives to a meeting to discuss options, which they say are limited as the amount of accidents, in their view, are not significant enough. One suggestion is for a Community Speed Watch Team to be set up. For this to be taken forward there needs to be volunteers.

There is a new Welsh Government Highways Minister and so there is a new opportunity to raise again the on-going safety and speed concerns with this road. I will be working with Russell George's office to raise concerns again in the hope that a fresh pair of eyes and ears may start to listen.

Garden Fires

With the Summer approaching, should you wish to have a garden fire, please follow the following Powys Council Guidance:

Warn your neighbours - lighting a bonfire can cause nuisance to your neighbours especially if it is a nice sunny day with washing out and windows open

Only burn dry material - this is likely to cause less smoke

Never burn household rubbish, rubber tyres or anything containing plastic, foam or paint - these can cause harmful emissions

Never use old engine oil, meths or petrol to light or encourage the fire

Avoid lighting a fire in unsuitable weather conditions - smoke hangs in the air on damp days and in the evening. If it is windy smoke may be blown into neighbour gardens and across roads

Avoid burning at weekends and on bank holidays when people want to enjoy their gardens Never leave a fire unattended or leave it to smoulder
