MOEL-Y-GOLFA: BIG JUST and the GYPSY MONUMENT

Moel-y-Golfa is the highest of the Breidden Hills, a volcano that erupted 450 million years ago. Many of us have climbed to the top and admired the views across to the Wrekin, Stiperstones, Cader Idris and the Berwyns, and the Severn meandering far below. On my visits I have also been curious about the Gypsy Monument. Who built it and how was it built? I recently read a press cutting from *The People* in November 1963 which answered many of these questions.

Ernest Burton was a Romany Chell (Chief), who travelled throughout our area and dealt in cattle and horses. Cars and trailers gradually replaced the horse-drawn caravans, but the work continued. His sons helped him break the horses in. Before he died in 1960, he asked his family to spread his ashes on the top of his favourite mountain. His son Uriah, better known as Hughie or Big Just, went up in a plane to carry out his father's wish. Later, he and his 'relatives and good friends' pledged to build a lasting monument, obtaining the permission of the landowners, Powis Estates. First they approached contractors, who said the task would be impossible. So they set about making a track, starting from the lane above Middletown Quarry.

Big Just explains in the newspaper article how he kidnapped members of the travelling community with handcuffs to join in the work they had pledged to complete. He brought the men from Wales, England, and even Scotland: 75 were on site during the first weekend. Big Just organized food and drink for them, and provided horse-boxes and a marquee as dormitories. Although he offered £4 a day, only ten of the 75 accepted his cash; the others worked 'as a matter of pride.' (£4 a day in 1963 represents about £75 today). The three huge stones of the monument came from Cornwall, of an especially hard granite. They weigh 12, 10 and 5 tons. They were loaded onto an eight-wheel lorry, lent by Mr Hepworth from Doncaster. With bulldozers at front and back, the unusual convoy began its slow ascent up the muddy track, which is steep in places. Big Just's brother Osiah calmly drove the lorry. Every few yards the men kept blocking and scotching (fastening) the lorry; chains '... snapped like candles. With wire ropes we fastened it to trees, but it pulled the trees out by their roots.' After two days, they reached the top. Unfortunately, Big Just does not explain how the higher stones were raised on top of the lower one, but perhaps someone can remember, and continue the story?

Big Just died in November 1986, and a second plaque was added to the monument. It states that 'Uriah was a fighter for the weak, good to the poor, teacher to the ignorant, and a true legend in his lifetime. He was known and respected by all gypsies and creeds. He was never beaten in fisty cuffs from the age of five to sixty. A man who led his people into the twentieth century. He was a good husband, father and granddad and was truly loved by all his family.'

Rodney's Pillar set to be demolished

Contractors working on behalf of Natural Resources Wales (NRW) to repair this iconic local landmark have discovered the structure is much more unstable than initial surveys showed. The current structure is set to be demolished, with NRW pledging to rebuild the monument in a way that faithfully reflects the original.



The pillar, atop Breidden Hill, is a popular

place to visit but meanwhile will remain cordoned off to ensure public safety. It was built in 1782 to commemorate the naval victories of Sir George Brydges Rodney during the American War of Independence. The pillar is of local stone, 54 feet (16m) high, and topped with a drum and finial which replaced the original gilded ball after a lightning strike in 1847. It is believed that the ships of the fleet were constructed from oak delivered from Montgomeryshire.

Postal rates up again!!

On October 2nd the price of a first-class stamp for a standard size letter increased from £1.10 to £1.25. It is the second time first-class postage has gone up this year. Second-class stamps for standard letters remain at 75p. A first-class stamp for large letters increased from £1.60 to £1.95 and a second-class stamp for a large letter went up from £1.15 to £1.56. Royal Mail has a full list of prices as from October 2nd on its website. Some Parcelforce prices also changed.



In addition business account customers will face paying a **Green Surcharge** of 2p an item as from November 6th to help fund "decarbonisation measures." Business account customers will also have to pay an additional 5p or 10p **Peak Surcharge** for deliveries between November 20th through to January 7th 2024. Full details can be found at:

Middletown Hill Race Wednesday 2nd August 2023

The reason the Dragon was flying on Middletown Hill, this race. Those that came to watch saw a great race. The juniors race at 7 for ages 6 -14 was fantastic, with 14 runners lining up at the start and were guickly underway, each age group has a different turn around and it wasn't long before the youngest were back to the finish, racing down the finish field better than some of the senior runners, who keenly watched hoping to pick up some race techniques. The last of the junior runners came in to rapturous applause. The seniors event at just 1.8 miles long may be mistaken for an easy race, but it has 1450ft of climb and descent in that distance. 80 runners were on the start line and were quickly off. By the time they were out of the start field (750m) the race had spread out, at the top of Middletown Hill the first time to the Red Dragon there was a clear leading group of five runners. Dominic Jones, Jack Agnew, Adam Bentham, Andy Watkins and last years winner Sara Willhoit, Though places changed out of sight on the precipitous descent to Belle Eisle on the other side of the hill, when they came back into view on the second climb up to the Red Dragon Jack and Adam had a clear lead, with Dom Jones in third place being chased by Andy and Sara.

On the final descent into the finish field Jack maintained first place in 24.03 Adam came in 2nd in 24.16, and Andy overtook Dom to take third spot with Sara finishing in 5th place.

This was a fantastic race to watch with the last runner over the line just under the hour. This is regarded as one of the toughest short races in the region. It is worth training for if you want to do next years event which is likely to be

Middletown Hill Race is part of the Shropshire Summer Series which is eight races from April to August each year with races from the Wrekin to the Long Mynd to Middletown Hill.

Hi, we hope you are all well and looking forward to the Summer holidays. This month we have done another joint update from both the community council and Cllr Amanda Jenner.

Reminder about the Speed Limit Changes

There has been some changes to the speed on some of our County roads. Along Criggion Road, from the trunk road to just past 31 Severn Wynde has become 20mph and from that point out to just past Garth and Gwelfryn properties, PCC plan to impose a 30mph limit. In Middletown, the road off the trunk road leading to the housing on Golfa Close etc, has become 20mph and the section from just after Pinewood House and Southbank, PCC plan to drop the speed limit to 30mph. The housing on the other side of the A458 towards Mount Pleasant has also become 20mph.

Potters Waste Management and Recycling Collections

Unfortunately, parts of the ward have had a number of recycling and waste collections missed on numerous occasions over the last few months. Cllr Amanda has asked the Portfolio Holder for Waste to address these as a matter of priority. Please continue to report any missed collections directly to the council here:



Local McDonald's awarded a 1-star rating after recent Food Standards Agency (FSA) inspection

Following a complaint from a member of the public concerning flies on the premises at Buttington Cross, environmental health officers from Powys County Council recently carried out a visit to investigate and undertake a full Food Hygiene Rating Scheme Inspection. A Food Hygiene Rating Score of one was subsequently awarded.

Ratings are a snapshot of the food standards found at the time of inspection. This includes – handling of food, how food is stored, how food is prepared, cleanliness of the facilities & how food safety is managed. Businesses which are given a 1 rating must make major improvements to hygiene standards. A food business operator has 21 days to appeal an awarded rating and/or request a revisit. At the time of writing (18 September) the one rating remains displayed in the restaurant's window.

Earlier this year the Buttington Cross McDonald's was named in an interview by 2 Michelin-star chef, Gareth Ward of Ynyshir Hall near Machynlleth, as his favourite place to eat out.
