### Local Residents targeted by Scammers

Dyfed-Powys Police wish to warn residents of scams currently prevalent in the area.



Texts and emails are being sent to lure people to apply for the Covid-19 vaccine.

DC Gareth Jordan, from the Cyber Crime Unit, said: The text is made to look like it comes from the NHS and states 'we have identified that you

are eligible to apply for your vaccine' and advises you to follow a link to get more information and 'apply'. If you follow the link, you are taken to a convincing looking, but fake NHS website that asks for your personal details. After entering your details, it then requests bank/card details to check your identity. Also, beware of cold calls and emails regarding the vaccine as scammers are also asking people to pay for it over the phone. Remember – the vaccine is free of charge and there is no way to jump the queue by paying for a "priority slot".

### Be on your guard against an Amazon scam.

Residents are being called, sometimes by an automated message, with scammers pretending to be from the online retailing giant to say that £79.97 is owed on their Amazon account—but if they don't want to pay, they can cancel Amazon by pressing '1'.

There may also be a call that states there has been unauthorised spending on the account (often over £1,000), and again, the request is to press '1' to go through to the 'Fraud Department'.

A police spokesperson says if 1 is pressed, then the scammers will attempt to get as many personal details as possible from the victim, and then try to gain access to their bank details. For any of these types of call, it is best to hang up immediately. If you don't have an Amazon account you will know the call is fake. Otherwise, check your account online by using the app on your phone, or by typing in the correct url such as www.amazon.uk and log into your account that way to check.

### Police advice:

- If you receive one of these phone calls, hang up and block the number.
- Confirm requests are genuine by using a known number or email address to contact organisations directly.
- Do not click on links or attachments in unexpected or suspicious texts or emails.
- If you have received an email, which you are not quite sure about, forward it to the Suspicious Email Reporting Service (SERS) at report@phishing.gov.uk.
- Suspicious text messages should be forwarded to 7726. This freeof-charge code enables your provider to investigate the origin of the text and take action, if found to be malicious. An easy way to remember 7726 is that they are the numbers on your telephone keypad that spell out the word SPAM.
- The NHS, the police, or your bank, will never ask you to withdraw money or transfer it to a different account. They will also never ask you to reveal your full banking password or PIN.
- Contact your bank immediately if you think you've fallen victim to a scam and report it to the Police.

# Residents warned about council tax reduction scam

Powys residents are being warned about fake emails, letters and phone calls claiming to offer council tax reductions and refunds.

One persuasive email currently doing the rounds is disguised by government branding, the use of similar wording to government communications, and is signed "The Government Digital Service Team".



Powys County Council can confirm this is a scam and residents are urged not to click on any links or give away any personal details.

Council tax scams are all the more confusing given that legitimate council tax bills are being issued to residents around this time, so people could mistake these as being genuine. All official correspondence will address you by name at the start of the message.

Powys County Council does offer council tax payment breaks and reductions for those struggling with financial difficulties due to Covid, but residents need to apply for this on the council's website.

If you are targeted by one of these scams you can report it to Action Fraud, Citizens Advice or report the message as "phishing" to the NCSC (National Cyber Security Centre) at <a href="mailto:report@phishing.gov.uk">report@phishing.gov.uk</a>

To report suspicious text messages, forward the message to 7226. This is a free message which alerts your service provider who will then look into the origin of the text and block the number.

### Garden Waste Collections Resume

With stickers being dispatched and bins for new customers being delivered, the 2021 garden waste recycling collections have begun.

If you haven't got round to renewing your subscription, or signing up for the first time, you can still do so anytime by visiting

www.powys.gov.uk/gardenwaste or calling 01597 827465



The annual subscription of £37, includes the hire of a 240-litre wheeled bin and fortnightly collections of your garden waste between 1 March and 3 December which, following resident's feedback, includes more collections than last year. A smaller 120litre bin is available at a reduced rate for households with small gardens, or compostable garden waste sacks for those who have their residual rubbish collected in purple bags.

If you are re-subscribing for another year, you will receive a sticker to place on your green wheeled bin to help indicate to the crew that you have signed up for the 2021 collections. New subscribers to the service will have their green wheeled bin delivered by the council within 10 working days.



# Coronavirus (COVID-19) Updates

- Self-isolating if there is a possible coronavirus infection in your household
- Legislation made to respond to the pandemic plus all the latest announcements relevant to Wales.

# At the time of writing (19<sup>th</sup> March) all of Wales remains at Alert Level 4. Current restrictions mean that everyone <u>must</u>:

- Follow social distancing rules with people you don't live with or who are not in your support bubble.
- Wash your hands regularly
- Wear a face covering (if you are able to) in all indoor public places.
- Not create an extended household (some people may be able to form a support bubble with one other household).
- · Meet only the people you live with or your support bubble indoors.
- Limit the number of people you meet socially (a maximum of 4 people from 2 households living locally can meet outdoors including in private gardens)
- Not travel outside of your local area without a reasonable excuse.
- Not travel internationally without a reasonable excuse.
- Self-isolate and get a test if anyone in your household has Covid-19 symptoms

# What can open (from 15 March & 22 March)

- Schools, colleges and childcare providers (informal childcare should be essential only)
- Higher Education Institutions (mix of in-person and remote learning)
- Places of worship
- Community Centres limited opening (for example, for essential public services)
- Crematoriums
- Playgrounds and public parks
- Weddings, in venues that are allowed to be open, and funerals (ceremony limit set by venue)
- Outdoor sports courts and golf courses
- · Hair salons and barbers for appointments only
- Garden Centres
- Shops that remained open during lock-down can now sell nonessential retail items

# First Minister, Mark Drakeford, has said that if public health conditions continue to be favourable, from 27 March:

- The stay local restrictions will be lifted to allow people to travel within Wales
- Self-contained holiday accommodation will re-open for one household
- · Organised children's activities outdoors will restart
- Libraries will reopen

The Welsh Government review on 1st April will consider whether all remaining shops and close contact services can reopen on the 12th April. This is in line with planned re-opening in England.

# **Upcoming elections**

# On Thursday 6 May 2021, Senedd and Police & Crime Commissioner elections in Wales are currently scheduled to take place.

Anyone aged 16 and over living in Wales, including qualifying foreign nationals, can register to vote in this year's Senedd Elections to have a say on issues affecting Wales such as education, healthcare, housing, environment, economy and the Welsh Language. **To vote on May 6 you must register to vote by April 19 2021.** 

### To find out more, or to register to vote go to www.gov.uk/register-to-vote

The Police and Crime Commissioner elections are different, and only those aged over 18 are eligible to vote. However, 16 and 17-year olds can register now so they can use their vote when they turn 18.

### Voting in Person at a Polling Station in line with Covid-19 Safety Guidance

Powys County Council is working with other councils and the Electoral Commission to ensure that everyone can vote safely in the May 6 elections in line with Covid-19 safety guidance. Anyone who wishes to vote in person at a polling station can be reassured that strict safety procedures will be in place to allow them to vote safely. You'll be sent a poll card approximately 2 weeks before the election date telling you when to vote and at which polling station. You can only vote at the polling station location stated on your card. If you do not take your polling card with you to the polling station you can still vote.

However, due to the coronavirus pandemic you may wish to consider your voting options, particularly if you are vulnerable, shielding, isolating or cannot make it to your polling station for reasons of mobility. You have the option to sign-up for postal voting so you can cast your vote from home ahead of polling day.

### How do I apply for a postal or proxy vote?

To find information on voting by post or by proxy (someone you trust on your behalf) and to download an application form go to **www.electoralcommission.org.uk/i-am-a/voter**. When completed & signed, your application form should be posted to Electoral Services, Powys County Hall, Spa Road East, Llandrindod Wells, Powys, LD1 5LG (or scanned and forwarded as an e-mail attachment to **electoral.services@powys.gov.uk**).

The deadline to apply for a postal vote for elections on 6 May 2021, is 5pm on 20 April.

The deadline to apply for a proxy vote for elections on 6 May 2021 is 5pm on 27 April.

Thank you to everyone who attended the recent online meeting regarding the incinerator.

Russell and I were able to give some cautious good news... In a statement published recently by the Welsh Gov, they have said "The moratorium on new large scale energy from waste (EFW) plants will cover those of 10MW or greater and comes into effect immediately."

We've been calling for a EFW Incinerator moratorium for some time and so obviously this is hugely welcome. However, we have been told by the Welsh Planning Inspectorate that they are awaiting clarification on what this means for incinerator planning applications already submitted. It may be that the moratorium does not take effect until the Minister comes to make a decision at the end of the process. Therefore, the planning consultation process could still start in mid April (unless Broad Energy withdraws it). During the meeting, we talked through the process and answered some questions raised by residents. As I've said before, it is so important that if the consultation does take place, that residents again submit their views to feed in to that process through the correct channels. As soon as I have the information on this from the planning inspectorate, I will let you all know.

That being said, if this moratorium does apply to the Buttington Incinerator development, I know so many of you will be hugely relieved.

It just goes to show that you should never think something is a done deal. It is always worth raising your views with your elected representatives. Thank you to Russell George MS and Craig Williams MP for working with me on this and let's hope that this means what we think it does! The recent Census asked people living in Wales about their ability to speak and/or understand the Welsh language. It is estimated that about a quarter of the population can speak Welsh fluently.




### Are you one of them?

# Reminder: you must complete the census by law

Census Day was on 21 March 2021. After this date Census Field Officers will be knocking on the doors of households that haven't completed a census. If YOU have yet to complete your census form the following guidance may help you:

- 1. Lost or not received your access code for completion of your census return online? You can request a new access code which can be sent to you by text to your mobile phone or by post. Visit www.census.gov.uk
- 2. Don't want to complete the census online? You can request a paper form at www.census.gov.uk or call 0800 169 2021.
- 3. If you need help in completing the census there is help section on the website. Alternatively telephone 018 7461 2394 (your local regional Census Support Helpline) between 9am-1pm or 2pm-5pm Mon-Fri. Closed Sats, Suns & Bank Holidays.
- 4. Prefer to answer census questions in Welsh rather than English? Online there are Cymraeg and English buttons to switch between languages at anytime. If you're filling in on paper, you can use Welsh and English on the same form if you so wish. It doesn't matter whether you are using the Welsh or English language version of the paper form.
- 5. You could be fined up to £1000 if you do not complete the census or supply false information. Some questions are clearly labelled as voluntary. It is not an offence if you do not answer these.
