Westbury Medical Centre Flu Season will start mid September

This year the clinics will have to be run differently due to Covid-19 restrictions

Initially we will be targeting patients in Care Homes, shielding patients and our at risk patients who have a chronic disease ie:- COPD, Chronic Kidney Disease, Chronic Heart Disease, Chronic Liver Disease, Diabetes, Splenic Dysfunction, a weakened immune system due Cancer Treatment or disease such as HIV/Aids, our over 65's, pregnant women, carers, children under school year 7 will also be targeted early. For those aged 50-64 we have to wait for further supplies from NHS England.

We will be running an appointment system, some of which will be conducted in cars in the car park and some of which we are hoping to be able to do in the building. Each will be operated on a one way system.

Please call the surgery on 01743 884727 to make an appointment.

PLEASE be PATIENT with us as this is all very new to us and we are trying to keep you and ourselves safe from risk of infection.

Pneumonia Injections for over 65's are available all year this is not an annual injection you usually only need one.

Shingles Injections are also available for 70-79 year olds all year and you only need it the once not annually

Nature Notes

This is a wonderful time of year to be enjoying our wonderful hills and valleys! Even though restrictions on our movements have been eased, I am staying local with my walks. On the Breidden Hills, there is plenty of wildlife to look out for throughout the

summer. Fallow Deer can be seen on the hills at any time of year, although it's more common to see the hinds than the stags with their magnificent antlers. They are not native to Britain; but were introduced from Continental Europe by the Romans. Our local population are descended from animals which escaped from Loton Park in Alberbury during the second world war. The open slopes of Middletown Hill are great for a variety of butterflies such as



Peacock, Speckled Wood and Meadow Brown. Small Tortoiseshells and Red Admirals appear in July and August. One tiny butterfly that is easy to overlook is the Small Copper, which is on the wing most of the summer. They can be found around



the gorse, bracken and bramble which is typical of Middletown Hill. The rare Pearl-bordered Fritillary also breeds here in small numbers, but by the time you read this, the adults' flight period is finished for this year. Another insect that is a common sight flying on the hills is the Speckled Yellow – not in fact a butterfly but a day-flying moth.

Overhead there are often Buzzards and Red Kites wheeling round, catching the warm air currents that enable them to gain altitude effortlessly without flapping. When I moved to Middletown in 1980, the Red Kite was a rarity in Britain, with only a few pairs in Wales and none in England. Now they are a common sight throughout our area; and seem to be especially common around Buttington and Hope. The Red Kite has been adopted as a logo by Powys County



Council. The kite's forked tail and long, narrow wings make it easy to separate from the more rotund Buzzard. Both these birds of prey are scavengers rather than predators, always on the lookout for dead rabbits. Buzzards also feed on large beetles and earthworms. One of our most conspicuous plants, the Foxglove,

all control co

attracts a great number and variety of bumblebees. The bees are lured into the individual flowers by a pattern of ultraviolet colouration. Although these patterns are invisible to us, they act like landing lights at an airport. Foxgloves are beautiful but dangerous: all parts of the plant are toxic. Now they are nearing the end of their flowering period.

There is a good network of signposted public footpaths throughout the Breidden Hills and more generally in our area. During lockdown, we were lucky not to have been cooped up in a large

city without a garden or access to the countryside. You probably noticed how much louder the birdsong was with so much less traffic on the roads. Wherever we may take our leg-stretch, jog, or bike ride, this is a wonderful area to enjoy nature, watch wildlife, and take deep breaths of our clean air! Enjoy your explorations, try out new footpaths, and stay safe!

Household Waste & Recycling Centres Now Open



All five Household Waste and Recycling Centres (HWRC) in Powys have reopened, with significant restrictions.

Opening times for Welshpool HWRC:

Mon & Tues: Closed

Wed – Fri: 9am – 5pm

Sat & Sun: 10am - 4pm

HWRCs across Powys are open for essential use only.

This **essential use** is for residents who have accumulated waste which cannot be collected through the normal kerbside collection service and which cannot be stored safely at home until the lockdown restrictions are eased.

Please think carefully before you decide to visit an HWRC. Non-essential use puts yourself, other members of the public and staff at risk from spreading the virus.

The following changes and rules apply to all five HWRCs:

- If you, or anyone in your household has coronavirus symptoms, you should follow the government and NHS guidelines, self-isolate and stay at home! Do not visit the HWRC. Any personal waste, such as tissues or wipes, should be double bagged and left for 72 hours before being put out for kerbside collection in a black wheeled bin or purple sack.
- You may be asked to provide proof of your address before entering the site please have this with you and show it to a member of staff when asked.
- 3. Cars, other vehicles and trailers, including those that need a CVT or Trade Permit** are allowed into the HWRCs. CVT permits must be placed against your closed vehicle window and will be scanned from the other side at the site entrance. ** Please note no Trade Permit holders will be allowed entry at weekends.
- 4. A limited number of vehicles will be allowed on site at any one time. It will be a strict one-in-one-out system— this will cause delays, please be prepared to queue patiently in your car. If there are too many people waiting to enter, you may be asked to return at a quieter time to avoid causing disruption to the highway and local communities.
- 5. Strict social distancing rules will be in place at all times. If these are breached, or you are abusive to staff, you will be asked to leave and the police may be called.
- **6.** Where possible there should only be one person per vehicle. If needed, to help with bulky or heavy items, a maximum of two people (from the same

household) may leave the vehicle to unload. These two people must stay together at all times whilst on site and not separate to take materials to different skips. **Staff on site cannot help unload or carry items under any circumstances.**

7. There will be a strict 10 minute time limit per vehicle when on site – please segregate waste before arriving to keep your visit short.

 Bulky Waste Collections, which were temporarily suspended at the start of the coronavirus outbreak, are now available to book via the Powys CC website subject to certain restrictions.



Dear all,

I hope that you've had an enjoyable summer despite us still being in very unusual times. There have been lots of things going on during the Covid-19 period and so I apologise for a rather detailed update.

COVID-19

Due to the lockdown, the Border Gossip was understandably not delivered to all residents in April/May and so my update regarding the team of local volunteers did not reach every resident in the ward. Nor did the information I put together regarding services, and shops/supplies which were able to deliver to our area during lockdown. I shared this information to as many people as I could, including over Facebook and I asked residents to share it with those they know who are not online. I hope this information reached many of you.

The week before lockdown myself and the Community Council set up a group of local volunteers made up of people from across the ward, who delivered leaflets to many of their neighbours and to those they were aware of who were isolating or in vulnerable groups. These leaflets offered support and contact details to those self-isolating. I'd like to re-iterate that this support network is still in place should anyone still be isolating or shielding. Please get in touch with either myself (details below) or Gill Corfield should you need to access this support.

Since March, on my Facebook page I have been sharing lots of information about the support available to both individuals and businesses during this Covid-19 period. This has included financial support as well as health information and services. If you would like to be provided with any of this information, please do get in contact with me.

PLANNING

There have been a number of planning applications submitted during the COVID-19 period. Initially, during lockdown the Powys Planning Committee was suspended which meant that local councillors, such as myself, could not ask for the committee of councillors to consider an application. Instead, Council officers would determine applications. I raised an objection to this and asked for discretion to be given in order to allow controversial applications to be delayed until the planning committee was able to meet again. The Planning Committee has now been set up to meet remotely and I have been liaising with the Council to request that one particular application, submitted prior to the Committee being reestablished, should be allowed to be considered by the Committee.

BUTTINGTON INCINERATOR UPDATE

At the start of lockdown, I contacted Broad Energy to ask for an assurance from them that they wouldn't start their consultation during the COVID-19 pandemic whilst we are unable to have public face to face meetings/gatherings. Such assurance was not provided.

Broad Energy subsequently told me that their plan is to hold a 'virtual consultation'. I asked them to reconsider this and explained that this would make it difficult for residents who may not have internet access or who may not be comfortable speaking on the phone. Also, for such a highly technical development, it is much easier to engage face-to-face than remotely. Unfortunately, Broad Energy did announce that they still plan to have a 'virtual' consultation. This is particularly disappointing given that this development has been in the pipeline for so many years now. Waiting until a consultation can be held at a time when public meetings are safe, does not seem unreasonable to me. It is also disappointing because myself and the Community Council had said we would like to hold a public meeting during this consultation period. I was also under the impression that Broad Energy had hoped to hold a public meeting too.

I have been in discussion with my political colleagues regarding the fact that Welsh Government are allowing 'virtual consultations' for highly technical and emotive planning matters such as this. A number of questions have been submitted to the Minister on my behalf about this. Also, because of the announcement by Broad Energy, I submitted a petition to Welsh Government which called for consultations such as these to be delayed until face-to-face meetings can be held again. I am pleased that this petition gained sufficient signatures to be considered by the Welsh Parliament Petition's Committee. The Committee considered the petition in July and appreciated the concerns. They agreed to write to the relevant Welsh Government Minister regarding the matter and at the time of writing this, I am awaiting for a further update.

FLY TIPPING

Unfortunately there is a growing pile of rubbish along Criggion Lane. The recent domestic rubbish which was left on the pile and spread across the road was reported and removed in July. Powys Council carried out an investigation and the perpetrator was identified. If you are aware of any fly tipping you can report it directly to the County Council. https://en.powys.gov.uk/article/4073/Report-fly-tipping

MOTOCROSS NOISE

A number of residents have contacted both myself and the Council regarding Motocross noise that was regularly coming from the Pool Quay area. The Council is looking into this matter in terms of whether it is causing a nuisance and whether those running the Motocross are acting within the permitted use of the land.

POWYS COUNTY COUNCIL

During the Covid-19 pandemic, many council meetings were set up to take place remotely. I have continued to attend Powys Council briefings, Health and Care Scrutiny, Foster Panel and Full Council meetings during this period. So far, these meetings seem to be well attended with scrutiny going particularly well online. I have also joined a cross party working group, set up to consider what steps the Council can put in place to meet its environmental targets.

THANK YOU

Finally I'd like to thank everyone involved within our community who have stepped up during this period. This includes: the amazing team of volunteers who have and continue to deliver shopping and more to their vulnerable neighbours, to all staff and governors at the school who worked tirelessly to set up remote learning, set up outdoor learning areas and new systems for when the children returned prior to the Summer. Also to the Community Council for continuing to hold remote meetings and ensure that local democracy continues.

Powys Libraries have introduced a free to use Order and Collect book-lending scheme operating from the new Welshpool Library (shared with Powysland Museum) at The Wharf.







The service allows you to request books from the library, either by telephone (01597 827460, Monday – Friday, 9am - 5pm) or by completing an online form at www.powys.gov.uk/orderandcollectbooks

Within a few days of submitting your request, you'll receive a follow-up communication with details of a collection date & time. You can have up to 10 items per library card. Books will be issued to your library card for a standard 4-week period. However, automatic renewal of books means that you don't have to worry about being fined if you can't get the books back on time.

You'll be given the opportunity to request from fiction and non-fiction, specify what format you'd like (e.g. Large Print, Audiobook) and say what types of books you're interested in. It is not possible to select books via the library catalogue or choose specific titles. Staff will do their best to find books and authors that you'll love. DVD loans are not possible.

Your selection of books will be packed up in a brand new paper bag and clearly marked with your name and library card number. The library doors will be open for you to enter and collect your bag at the allotted time. You will not be able to go in the library to browse. If you have booked a collection slot but find later that you can't make it you are asked to contact the request line on 01597 827460 or email library@powys.gov.uk Collection by family members, friends or volunteers is permissible if you ensure they have details of your full name and library card number.

If you cannot arrange for someone else to collect on your behalf *and* you are shielding or self-isolating with Covid-19 symptoms it may be possible for the library to co-ordinate a delivery through their network of volunteers and community groups. If you would like to volunteer to help take books to people who live near you it would be a great help. Please register at your local volunteer bureau or online with PAVO at https://powys.volunteering-wales.net/vk/volunteers/index.htm

The library service is taking every precaution to ensure that the books you request are safe to

handle. Staff have appropriate PPE and are adhering to strict guidelines for handling books. All books are quarantined for a minimum of 72 hours before the agreed collection date and for the same amount of time upon their return, After you have collected your books it is recommended that you leave them in the bag for a further 72 hours before handling them. This is in accordance with guidance from Public Health Wales. Books should be returned in the same bag that they were originally packed in. The bag will be disposed of for recycling as soon as your order is returned to the library (when you collect your next order).

If you are a library member wishing to research family history, whilst libraries are closed you can search the free to use library version of Ancestry from home. Go to the online library catalogue and log in with your library card number and PIN. You will then be able to access the link to Ancestry. Members can also borrow ebooks and eAudiobooks from Borrowbox and download top magazines and comic-books from RBdigital, all for free.

RESPONSE FROM BUTTINGTON INCINERATOR IMPACT GROUP REGARDING BROAD ENERGY'S "VIRTUAL CONSULTATION"

Here at BilG, we are horrified by plans by Broad Energy to launch the incinerator project during lockdown. The Developers, Broad Energy, having delayed the project by almost four years have now chosen to launch it at a time of national crisis.

This is a massive and highly controversial industrial project which local people see as a threat to their health and well-being. The lives of many people in the local community are dominated by the pressures and stress created by COVID 19 and to launch this project now is unbelievably insensitive. It is particularly disappointing because the Managing Director of Broad Energy is a member of the local family that owns the site for the new incinerator. Broad Energy have said that they will hold a virtual consultation. Many people in our community, particularly the older and more vulnerable do not connect with the virtual world of the internet and social media. It is wrong that they should be denied involvement in something of such major importance.

The consultation on this project must be as broadly based as possible because of the complexity of what is involved. It is essential that people have the opportunity to take part in public meetings so that they can ask questions, listen to other people's responses and give their own feedback. This is fundamental to our democracy and has always been a part of our planning process.

We therefore ask Broad Energy to treat the local community with the decency and respect they deserve by listening to their views and therefore hold back on the consultation until lockdown is over. They have a history of delaying this project for business reasons. Now is the time to delay it so that the community can have a proper say about something that would affect their lives so much.
